Winster Weather Forecast

The Winster Website now includes a specific Winster Weather Forecast, covering the next five days, three hours at a time. The forecast is updated every hour.

Winster's is one of about 5,000 local forecasts that the Met Office now offers as part of the Government's "Open Data" scheme (which also covers other previously expensive data, like the latitude and longitude of each postcode): anyone who registers can access the data free of charge, and do (almost) whatever they want with it: I've knocked up a simple Winster Forecast summary for the main page of the website, and a more detailed listing on a separate page. Your chance to influence DCC on off-roading

Derbyshire County Council is consulting the public on a new policy for managing off-road vehicles on the Peak District's green lanes. Everyone living in the Peak District knows about the damage to the environment and the danger to other people being caused by off-roading. For years, we have had to put up with deep ruts, worn out surfaces, noise, pollution and danger.

As the main highway authority in the Peak District, DCC has legal powers which it can use to put an end to the damage and danger. It can use traffic regulation orders to close lanes to vehicles wherever offroading is doing serious damage or is a risk to other people. It has written a new policy to help it manage off-roading and it is consulting the public on the draft You can find the draft of the new DCC policy at www.dcc.gov.uk Put the words consultation and vehicles in the search box. Then scroll down to 'Management of Motorised Vehicle Use in the Countryside'. Or you can write to your local county council Simon Spencer

Please tell him how off-roading affects you, your family and your village. Ask him to do his utmost to make sure DCC uses the full scope of its legal powers to ban off-road vehicles wherever they are a danger or make it impossible for other people to use local lanes and byways. You could also copy your letter to your Derbyshire Dales District Councillor and to the Parish Council. The consultation closes on 14 March.

Thanks Peak District Green Lanes Alliance

Police are asking residents and businesses to be aware of persons obtaining card details by deception and using the information to pay for goods over the telephone.

The callers, generally identifying themselves as either Mr Robinson or Mr Walker or other (probably false names), are using various mobile phones to contact residents purporting to be from their bank, saying their cards have been intercepted. They ask for card details saying that the bank will issue a new card. Unfortunately, some people have become a victim and given this information to the caller who has then made purchases fraudulently. They then arrange for the goods to be delivered to a particular place, where they arrange for a courier to collect the goods.

In the latest incident, a quad bike has been purchased using stolen bank card details.

Enquiries are being made but police are asking people not to give out their bank card, credit card or account details - your bank will have these details and would not contact you to ask for them.

Following the presentation of our habitat improvement plan to the Parish Council on November the 7th, Dave Frost and I are pleased to report that we received formal acceptance of the plan from the Parish Council in early December. We have had quite a lot of interest and support for the project from people in the village during these early stages and we are now keen to get moving with work on the ground as soon as possible. Initially Dave and I are intending to complete the tree works. As this part of the project involves noisy, dangerous chainsaws and wood chippers, we thought it better if we seasoned tree men did it! After this we intend to invite willing volunteers to assist with weed removal, stream clearance and aquatic planting. We also want to start discussions with the various stakeholders about our idea to create a community woodland in that area as part of general improvements to the pond and its immediate surroundings. As always, I will keep you posted.
