## **The new recycling bins at Banktop**

The new facilities consist of five bins that take mixed glass, cartons, tins, cans, plastics and cardboard, to be sorted at the depot, and a further bin for newspapers. They look very neat and just fit into the available space at the edge of the car park. They were very handy after Wakes Week, when it was much quicker to deposit items that didn't have to be separated, and no doubt they will be useful again after Secret Gardens and many events in the Burton Institute.

The view has been expressed on the Parish Council that the bins attract fly-tipping and that it may be possible to do away with them once the kerbside collection of recyclables has been fully implemented. But I would be sorry to see this happen. They are a godsend to those of us who still have to use black sacks or small containers rather than wheelie bins. And if people from outside Winster use this service, so what? At least Winster can be seen to be encouraging recycling.

One downside is that the new bins seem to have less capacity than the old ones. Certainly they have been full or nearly full several times already. ## **Gold Card re-issue**

Please help us to spread the word that most Gold Cards (the bus pass for older and disabled people) expire in March 2013. We need to know about any changes since the issue of the current card, for example, a change of address. Anyone whose details have changed should complete a [form online](#) so that we can make sure that all our cardholders receive their new cards correctly.

Note: Anyone over 60 (depending on your date of birth) can have a Gold Card – the travel, discount and library card for Derbyshire residents. It is a blue striped card. Some younger people, with certain disabilities, can also have a Gold Card. It is an orange striped card. Gold Card allows you to travel free, off-peak on local buses throughout the whole of England, get discounts at around 1,300 shops and other local businesses and to borrow at all Derbyshire and Derby city libraries.

Gold Card holders can also use community transport dial-a-bus services. You will be charged a £1 flat rate single fare (£2 return). It doesn't matter how far you travel on a dial-a-bus, the fare is the same.

## **No parking on the common? A chance to express *your* point of view**

I'm very concerned that there is not much opportunity for people in Winster to express their points of view about issues that arise from time to time. Because of lack of space, contributions to the Village Magazine are usually restricted to about half a page, which is too little for any case to be argued. And if members of the public attend a meeting of the Parish Council they are given only a few minutes right at the beginning to have their say. By the time of the Annual Village Meeting, contentious matters have usually already been decided.

It seems to me that the village might benefit from having an occasional publication dealing in greater depth with issues of the moment, and I am prepared to try out the idea at my own expense and circulate a copy to every home in Winster. One topic of the moment that many people are concerned about is the possibility that parking on the common may be banned. In fact, one parish councillor has said that he will resign if it goes ahead.

I invite those of you who would be affected or have a view on this to send me your thoughts. This includes those who have already sent letters on the subject to the PC, for and against the ban. Obviously I will have to have some editorial oversight, but I will try very hard to be impartial and give a fair balance. Please email [geoff@orchardmine.co.uk](mailto:geoff@orchardmine.co.uk) or leave a note or letter at the post office. If necessary, telephone 650090 and I will agree your statement with you. All contributions must be named and reach me by 13 August. If it's simply to say 'for' or 'against' a ban, that would be OK. Let's see if this can help improve open, democratic decision-making in Winster. Thank you.

## Winster Pond Update

We presented our plans for further improvements to the area around the pond at the Parish Council meeting on 2nd July. These include improving and expanding existing hedgerows, planting native trees amongst existing trees at the top of the site, grassland improvements and planting a community orchard. The plans are in draft at present but we are using them to source funding and there will be a period of planning and consultation with the village over the orchard before plans are finalised. We are waiting for the Parish Councils endorsement of the plans before we can start planning the work. More work on the pond will be undertaken towards the end of August. This will involve the removal of a large quantity of dominant plants in preparation for new aquatic planting in Spring 2013. If anyone would like further information about plans for the area or would like to lend a hand with any work then please contact me or Dave. As always, we will keep you posted.

### **Winster Outdoor Play Area Scheme—Now Open!**

“In Autumn 2011 a group of young mums (and me, a grandma) got together and decided to do something about the village’s play area. The equipment had been installed at the Silver Jubilee in 1977 and was in the control of the Parish Council. We wanted to install new apparatus and have it open for the Diamond Jubilee. We needed to raise £9,000 which was half the total amount, as the Parish Council who own the land were going to take out a matching loan.

Jonathan Simcock at DDVCS was very enthusiastic and suggested about seven grant-giving bodies to apply to. We were successful in two of them, £3,000 from Derbyshire Dales District council and £1,000 from the DCC Community Leadership Scheme. We also asked for donations from local firms and individuals, some of whom responded very generously, including donations of free materials and labour. We also had some terrific fund-raising events, shows in the village hall, an auction of signed sport shirts, the race night and so on. Mission accomplished! Marg Lester”
