Winster Pond Update

The Parish Council have deliberated over our plans for a community orchard and landscape improvements to the area around the pond. The outcome is disappointing and we feel that a great conservation opportunity may have been missed. In our opinion, this is due mainly to the way that decisions are made on this Parish Council. It seems odd that due to the fact that we are initially given only 15 minutes to introduce the scheme, then are unable to have input to crucial discussions during the subsequent meeting and provide information at the appropriate time on technicalities about the project that councillors clearly don't understand; final decisions are not fully informed and based on misunderstandings. It is very frustrating and discouraging to people offering their time and expertise on an entirely voluntary basis, trying to implement projects that are of benefit to the wider village, to be confronted with this process. So much for big society!

Regardless of this, we intend to consult with the village about the community orchard and are inviting all comers to an open meeting at the Burton Institute on Monday 8th October at 7.30pm. The meeting will give people the opportunity to be involved, discuss the plan and answer any questions.

Weed clearance has been carried out in the pond in preparation for aquatic in the Spring. We intend to do another day on Sunday 30th September 9.30 am onwards, everyone welcome.

Car Parking – Winster

I am writing to express my concern about the wish of the Parish Council to stop cars from parking on the Burma Road and presumably at the top of East Bank. Winster has a problem with car parking in general and I am puzzled why the common area has been sought out for particular attention. Cars have been parked up there for as long as I have been in the village and according to older stagers, for many years before that! What is the particular need to threaten draconian action at this time and apparently without taking views of the people who will be most affected? I strongly believe that the PC should seek these views at a specially convened meeting with all who have an interest in this matter. There should be an opportunity for a full and frank two way dialogue before the PC takes any final decisions.

I was pleased to note the way in which the PC cooperated with a group to establish the playground on Woodhouse Lane which is a credit to the village. I am sure that a similar approach to the common issue could be of equal benefit.

Dales Housing - communication and referral links

I am based at Dales Housing In Matlock as a Senior Housing Officer focusing on the letting of our empty properties, particularly those more suited to older people. There seems to be a misconception that the type of accommodation provided by Dales Housing i.e. 'social housing' is for unemployed people or those in receipt of welfare benefits. This is incorrect; a large number of our tenants are in full time employment or have previously owned their own property. Dales Housing's rents are very competitive and present an affordable housing choice in locations throughout the Dales. Our properties are also repaired and maintained to a very high 'lettable' standard, which compares very favourably to private rented accommodation. Our properties are available to applicants who currently own their own home but would like to move closer to family members for support.

We currently have a number of properties available for older applicants aged 55 and over. These properties range from 1 bedroomed flats in various locations throughout the Dales, where the Housing Officer calls on a daily basis, or flats or studios within schemes, where a 'warden' is on site during the day and there are facilities such as a communal lounge and IT suite and activities are organised on a regular basis, such as keep fit, coffee mornings, lunches, art sessions and fruit and veg sales! As accommodation for older applicants is called 'sheltered' this can sometimes be off putting as it suggests a care or nursing home situation. This is totally incorrect – all applicants live independently but just have the reassurance of a daily visit and a call alarm facility.

Properties are currently allocated via the Home Options choice based lettings scheme, which is internet based and applicants place a 'bid' to register their interest. Property sheets can also be posted out to older applicants and are displayed in libraries etc.,

Derbyshire Constabulary Care Card Service

To contact the police when it's not an emergency, Derbyshire Constabulary has a Care Card scheme for people with a disability or illness that affects their telephone use, or who may become confused or agitated during prolonged or stressful circumstances.

This local rate number is for when you want to ask a question, get some information or want to report a crime such as reporting a Hate Crime, lost property or criminal damage.

The card can also be shown to a trusted person or official (for example ambulance staff, security staff, shop staff, police officers and staff) so they can find out how to help the person in difficult or crisis situations

Any person can register by telling us about their specific needs and issues, and by giving us the contact details of people who could help them in times of difficulty.

Once a person is accepted onto the scheme they are registered on our Care Card database and issued with a small card with a unique reference number on it, along with a special telephone number for them to use to contact us.

The scheme is administered by the Corporate Services Department at Headquarters and any potential applicants or queries should be forwarded to Natalie Cockram Tel No 01773 572806 .
