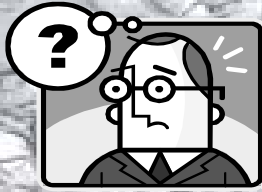

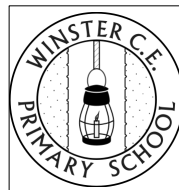
Winster School is looking for a Community Governor

Combine: Farming Heritage East Midlands

The newly refurbished Derbyshire Record Office in New Street, Matlock is the current venue to host the regionally significant Combine: Farming Heritage| East Midlands exhibition. Delivered by Chesterfield based Junction Arts, the project involved young people from the six counties of the East Midlands working with an historic farm, archivists and curators to research the rich farming heritage of the region. They also tried traditional skills and worked with an artist to create an original artwork, a new map of their county.

The Derbyshire group were from Highfields School and they visited Manor Farm in Dethick, the Record Office and Old House Museum. They worked with a skilled craftsman at the Eco Centre to make a dry stone wall and gathered oral histories from the Farming Life Centre and Tansley House residential home. The oral histories are particularly valuable and can be read and heard

on the project website www.combinefarmingheritage.org.

The exhibition showcases all the exciting activities that have taken place and is your chance to view for the first time the Derbyshire map. The exhibition will be at the Record Office until 27th April before continuing its tour until 2014.

WINSTER PARISH COUNCIL SNOW VOLUNTEERS

Following the recent article in the village magazine the Parish Council were extremely pleased with the number of residents who contacted us to volunteer to assist in clearing snow from footways in the village. These new volunteers increased our complement from three to nine.

During recent weeks when we have experienced several heavy snow falls, these volunteers have done an absolutely brilliant job in regularly clearing snow from the pavements and I take this opportunity to express on behalf of the council sincere and grateful thanks for their involvement.

Winstre Parish Council has received a number of written and verbal comments from residents expressing their gratitude for the snow clearance works carried out in the village. In a parish you never really know what older people have lived through. In one parish there was a man who was from Malaya and he'd suffered a terrible stroke. When he died I found out he was in charge of bringing polio treatment to the country. He'd saved many lives. Another man I met was a laugh and a character but one day he spoke of being in the war. He was in the medical corps; he was one of the first soldiers into Auschwitz. He spoke to me of the first hand experience of seeing that horror. He was along with other people trying to care for many many people very close to death. He felt over whelmed; he was angry at God and asked where God was in that terrible nightmare, the result was that he lived a very full life but a core value was caring for other people. His faith didn't leave him because he finally saw God in those who held the hands of the dying and even deeper he saw God in the eyes and bodies of those who were dying. The suffering happened because of one group felt it was stronger, more important and more righteous and more in tune with God's voice than another. May we leave behind any prejudice and any hatred or any anger and so be free to serve our communities and our world. And may we see in all people the face of God.
