USE YOUR VOTE ON 2ND MAY!

DON'T forget to vote on Thursday 2 May when all 64 seats on Derbyshire County Council will be up for grabs.

No fewer than 266 candidates will fly the flag for 10 political parties as a new council is elected for the first time in four years.

Eligible voters who don't turn out on polling day will miss their chance to say how £525m is spent each year – excluding schools – on vital services for more than 760,000 local people.

And there is plenty of time to vote because polling stations will be open from 7am to 10pm.

Broadband in Winster by John Geddes

Winster's Broadband isn't dreadful: most people download at 5 to 7 Mbps. That is OK for now, but it will look very tired as 20Mbps+ rapidly becomes the norm in urban areas. Winster is unlikely to see any improvement from the £530m of government spending on improving rural broadband: it looks as if all of the money will go on bringing 2Mbps to people who are currently slower. Once BT have hoovered up the subsidy, they may find it profitable to bring substantially faster services (involving fibre-optic cables and powered cabinets on pavements) to a few rural spots with a high density of high-spending customers. But that probably excludes places like Winster. So, the picture for Winster looks like this:

- If you get at least 5Mbps and that is OK for your needs, do nothing
- If you get more than 5Mbps but need a lot more, see the village website (winster.org) for a note on (higher-cost) wireless and satellite options.

If you are getting less than 5Mbps, see the village website for suggestions on how to try and get that improved.

And if you ever find yourself in conversation with policy-makers at any level, bend their ear to the fact that without further investment, places like Winster run the risk of becoming digital backwaters in future years. Younger people increasingly won't move to communities without good internet speeds, and villages will see their age profiles getting older and older unless we get better infrastructure.

BADOG members will have their usual preferential rate of just £1 to attend whilst guests and non-members will pay £3 per head.

Derbyshire Trading Standards are warning consumers about an Alarm Company currently going door to door in the Derbyshire Dales area. Typically the salesman offer a relatively cheap, or even free, alarm system but fail to mention or gloss over the very expensive monitoring and maintenance charges which can be thousands of pounds a year. This trader is also asking consumers for a small cheque made payable to The Police and Crime Commissioner, presumably to deceive consumers that they are working with or approved by the Commissioner – which they are not.

Traders misleading consumers about the true price of goods or services or giving a misleading impression that they are approved or endorsed by anyone are committing offences under Trading Standards regulations. If you are aware of traders like these in your area please let us know by contacting the Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline on 08454 04 05 06 to report such activity and get advice about consumer issues.
