Secret Gardens – 2013

After the weeks of glorious sunshine and relentless heat that led up to the Secret Gardens weekend, we were somewhat surprised by the dramatic drop in temperature over the weekend. But people still made the effort to come and visit us, even in the somewhat drizzly weather on the Sunday. Visitors numbers were slightly down on last year but still impressive, around 1550 people came over the weekend to view over 20 gardens and enjoy the many other attractions on offer.

An enormous Thank You to everyone who helped in any way: whether before the event, during the weekend itself or clearing away afterwards. Special thanks to all the garden openers, without whom we would not have an event, to performers, and to everyone involved in making and serving refreshments – they really add to the experience.

We should like to give a special mention to Kate Worthington, who organised a team of senior Girl Guides to help with serving refreshments. In return, Secret Gardens made a £250 donation towards their fundraising efforts for the 'Girlguiding Midlands Jailbreak Challenge', which took place across Europe in early August. We also made a similar donation to the Buxton Air Cadets for their help in marshalling the car park over the weekend.

As in previous years, the feedback from visitors was fantastic. One of the many positive comments was "Fabulous gardens and village".

Our costs were significantly higher this year. We had to buy some new equipment, hire in a portaloos and the insurance costs were significantly more than in previous years - but it looks as if we have raised around £6,800!!!!

Finally, my grateful thanks to the Committee for their tremendous support and hard work in planning the event and ensuring it ran so smoothly. Secret Gardens 2014 is on 19th and 20th July – please make a note in your diary.

There has been a big change in the Monday-Saturday timetable for buses between Darley Dale and Sheffield. The old 214 Matlock--Sheffield service no longer runs: instead, service 218 now runs Matlock-Chatsworth-Bakewell-Sheffield. Sunday services on route 215 are unchanged.

The new route means a noticeably slower journey between Darley Dale and Sheffield: you can save 30 minutes if you pick up the 218 at Bakewell instead. And anyone wanting to change to/from the train at Grindleford (eg for Edale and Manchester) now has only the two-hourly service 275 from Bakewell.


Thanks to Rosie Strauss for donating her collection. The History Group now has a near complete run from 1986 to the present. We still need others to fill the gaps.

Posters warning would-be criminals that sheds, garages and other outbuildings are alarmed are being handed out as part of an anti-burglary drive. The large signs, which read 'Warning: Alarmed', will be put up on or near people's property to act as a deterrent to criminals. They have been designed after a rise in non-dwelling burglaries and are available free of charge to anyone living in the Derbyshire Dales. The posters are also given out when people buy cut-price security kit such as shed alarms and spotlights as part of the ongoing Operation Illuminate.

The posters can be collected from police stations in Bakewell, Matlock and Ashbourne, providing the recipient has a Derbyshire Dales address.

Councillor's Corner

Serco has repaid £75,000 to the Council in compensation for costs incurred during the waste collection shambles in late 2012. When Serco took over the waste collection service, the Council had to draft in extra staff to man the phones, deliver new bins and carry out 'mop-up collections' as the system fell into chaos. I have been calling for this money to be repaid for some months now and I am pleased that it has finally happened. Although I am assured that the money will fully reimburse the taxpayer, it will not compensate Winster residents for the poor service they received and missed bin collections for up to 3 months. I have pressed the Council to provide a breakdown of the repayment so Councillors can make sure it is a good deal for the taxpayer.

Over the past few weeks I have met in Winster with new Deputy Cabinet Member for Highways, Councillor Andy Botham to look at outstanding high-ways problems. These included the poor state of some roads, winter gritting, road markings, drainage and more. I have put together a report on all of these matters and handed it over to Councillor Botham. He will now take this to County Hall for consideration and he will be reporting back to the Parish Council in due course. As always, I will keep you updated.
