Winster Local History Group Next Meeting

Monday 25 November at 7.30 in the Burton Institute
Dry-Stone Walling and Traditional Vernacular Stone Building, by master craftsman Will Noble

Will Noble is a really interesting character. When he was aged 13 his father, a Yorkshire farmer, got him to quarry stone that he had come across while digging in the garden. Will dressed the blocks and built a wall that stands to this day. From these beginnings he progressed to be champion dry-stone waller, and his work can be seen in the Yorkshire Sculpture Park, Wakefield, and in field walls all over the country. He has also visited the USA several times to carry out commissions for the landscape sculptor and environmentalist Andy Goldsworthy.

Will is also a master-mason and has worked several times on commissions at the Chelsea Flower Show. His illustrated talk will also show some of the historic vernacular buildings he has restored and others newly built in traditional styles.

And, as if that wasn't enough, Will is a well-known folk singer, who performs at Folk Festivals at home and abroad. If there is time, we may be able to get him to perform.

This information is then fed to the police's National Fraud Intelligence Bureau to gain a more complete national picture of fraud. Action Fraud also provides a wide range of information about how to protect yourself from becoming a victim.

Organic Gardening Advice

Bare soil often appears at this time of year as summer growth fades and is pulled out or dies back. But bare soil over winter is not ideal. Nutrients will leach, weeds often germinate, and soil structure can be damaged in bad weather. **Cover bare soil with a mulch.** Use last year's autumn leaves if you have them, or several sheets of newspaper (6 should do the job), spread out and covered with the last of the lawn mowings. **Don't** use compost or manure. All their valuable nutrients will be wasted during winter rains. In early spring, pull back the mulch where bulbs are likely to pop up.

Winter can be a tough time for many of our garden friends. Spare a thought for the pest munchers and the bug eaters, and give them a cosy shelter from winter weather. In some areas hedgehog populations have declined by up to 50%. A good heap of leaves at the back of the border or under a bushy hedge could make all the difference for these slug predators. Build a shelter in a corner for all the useful aphid eaters out there. And don't be too tidy when clearing away dead and dying plants. Hollow stems can be good habitats too.
