

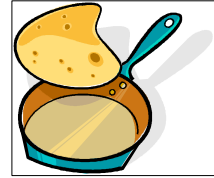

Just time to participate in Derbyshire County council's proposals to reduce the mobile library service. There is a questionnaire available on line and also from the mobile library but be aware the closing date is 1 March 2014.

There will be further consultations May/June but the proposals will be likely to remove the service to Winster.

There are substantial changes to the 172 bus timetable from Monday 31st March. At first sight it looks like there are fewer buses - but actually there are just as many buses on a weekday, and more on a Saturday (the same service will run Monday to Saturday). And the good news is that most of the buses will run (via the town-centre Bakewell Road stop) to Matlock Railway Station. If all runs to time, they will provide a good connection with trains there in both directions. Thanks to all who have written to DCC over the years to encourage them to achieve this.

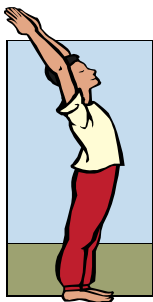

Are you still using Windows XP?

[If you don't know, press the Start button on your computer, choose Control Panel, then System]

Microsoft are stopping all support for Windows XP on April 8th this year. Why does that matter? Until now, Microsoft have updated XP with patches every month (automatically, so you may not have realised) to tackle newly-found security vulnerabilities. After April 8, there will be no more patches, so as the evil underworld continue to find new ways of compromising XP computers, they will have an growing array of untackled approaches with which to hijack XP computers that are connected to the internet (and potentially other PCs via shared files). So, sticking with XP after April 8th is going to be a fairly brave thing to do. If you don't fancy the extra risks, the easier option is to replace your PC: a new PC with Windows 8 will have an app to move your data, but you will still have to reinstall most of your software, and some old hardware (eg scanners or printers) may not work. The cheaper (but more laborious) approach is to upgrade Windows on the same PC – you will need to back up your data externally before upgrading. At the time of writing, Amazon were charging £85 for a new copy of Windows 8.1 There is a program to predict how well your existing PC and peripherals will cope with Windows 8 before you take the plunge – Google “Windows 8 Upgrade Assistant”.

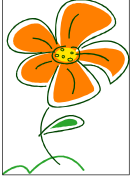
Winstar Entertainments Group Presents 'Richard Durrant in Concert'

For the Church we are now in Lent. In the past Lent was often seen as a time to see oneself as a (as the Book of Common Prayer put's it) "Miserable Sinners". At first sight sinners may not seem miserable, but so often sin is the distortion of the gifts of God. Take for example 'gluttony' is an abuse of God's gift of food. or 'lust' is the abuse of a fellow person; seeing them more as a possession than as a person of great beauty. A person who is made in God's image and likeness. Lent is a time to look again at our lives and asking are we generous, kind, loving, open to God's Grace? Lent is a season of questions.
