Parish Precept

The Parish Council is funded by a levy (known as the 'precept') decided annually by the Parish Council, and paid by us all as part of our Council Tax. For financial year 2014/5, the Parish Council budget for providing local services will be £14,408. The council will carryover a surplus of £1,666 from 2013/14, receive a grant of £700 in Council Tax Support, therefore the Winster Precept for 2014/15 will be £12,042 (unchanged from 2013/14). However your Council Tax bill will show a 1.4% increase on the previous year due to the decrease in the number of band D properties in the village.

This month's useful tip

Do the bows on your shoelaces point North-South or East-West?

If they point North-South, then you have created a granny-knot that will tend to come undone easily. Change the initial crossover of the laces (left-over-right if you previously used right-over-left and vice versa) and you should have a reef-knot with the bows pointing East-West and staying done up far longer.

Councillor's Corner

Since the withdrawal of the Bank Top recycling site, I have been contacted by a number of residents who have asked questions about the decision to remove the facility. I would, therefore, like to clarify the situation once more. The bins were not provided by the District Council, but owned and supplied by a private company called HW Martin. The company provided the facilities at no cost to the District Council or the taxpayer, but instead made money through the sale of the materials deposited at the site. With doorstep recycling increasing and the usage of the Bank Top site decreasing, HW Martin was suffering significant losses and had no choice but to withdraw the site. The District Council have made it clear that they do not have the funds or the resources to provide an alternative at the present time.

I would like to remind residents that they can request an additional blue box or bag free of charge from the District Council to enable them to recycle more materials on the doorstep. Please contact me if you would like help with this. The Northwood Household Waste Recycling Centre is also open to the public daily between 8:30am and 6pm. The site is situated just off the A6 between Darley Dale and Rowsley.

Finally, I was pleased to support and vote for another 'freeze' in the District Council's share of your council tax for the coming year.

As I look out of my office window I can see the flowers starting to come through and the grass start to grow. Nature is a wise teacher and those who take note of it are wiser still. In Churches we have what's known as Sacraments -it's a 'sign of a reality' ; for example, Baptism is celebrated with water, oil and family and special Words. The Holy Eucharist or Holy Communion is celebrated using Bread and Wine and Special Words. Spring is like a Sacrament it points us all to a reality. It points us to new life and new hope. Christianity is about reality, it is about the brutal truth that life is hard and we all live and die. In Holy Week we walk with Jesus through the liturgy's each day. We don't spiritualize the events we reflect and respect the fate of Jesus. We listen to the Gospel Stories and we hold in silent vigil the events of Good Friday and Holy Saturday. Just like when we lose our loved one we watch and wait helplessly. That is the reality of Holy Week from Palm Sunday 13th April until East Sunday we watch and pray. on Good Friday at 10am at St. Mary's South Darley there will be a children's service with a few hymns, coffee & Hot Cross Buns and of course Chocolate for the children. Be assured of the prayers of the United Benefice over the Holy Week and Easter period.
