Winster Defibrillator

As many of you will have noticed, the defibrillator has now arrived and is in a bright yellow box on the outside wall of the village shop on the Woodhouse Lane side. It was officially installed by this year's Carnival Queen, Natasha Slater, on Wakes Saturday.

Anybody can use the defibrillator. So if someone has a heart attack, just dial 999 and the operator will give you the key code for the box. The machine is in a small carry case inside. All you have to do is press the 'on' button and the machine will give you voice instructions of exactly what you need to do. You can't go wrong, but time is of the essence, so act as quickly as possible.

However, to help people feel confident about using the defibrillator in an emergency, we will be organising a 2-hour familiarisation session for anyone who is interested. This will also cover how to do CPR (manual resuscitation), which someone should do while the defibrillator is being fetched. The session will be advertised in the Village Magazine. LIGHTS OUT event supported by Derbyshire Dales

Derbyshire Dales District Council is supporting LIGHTS OUT from 10pm to 11pm on 4 August when everyone in the UK is invited to turn off their lights, leaving on a single light or candle for a shared moment of reflection. The poignant event marks the centenary of the outbreak of the First World War and people can take part in whatever way they choose, either individually or by attending one of the many events being organised around the country for a collective experience. Derbyshire Dales District Council will be turning off the lights at its Matlock Town Hall headquarters, leaving on a single light in a civic office that overlooks the town centre.

LIGHTS OUT is the headline project of 14-18 NOW, the official cultural programme for the First World War Centenary Commemorations. The inspiration for LIGHTS OUT comes from a famous remark made on the eve of the outbreak of war by the then Foreign Secretary, Sir Edward Grey: “The lamps are going out all over Europe; we shall not see them lit again in our life-time”.

Councillor's Corner

As you might be aware, the funding that Derbyshire County Council receives from the government is being significantly reduced. The authority is expected to make £157 million worth of savings by 2018. The County Council is now looking at how it provides local services. In some cases services will have to be run differently, some will be reduced and others stopped altogether. One service that will be affected is the Mobile Library service and this has led to a number of Winster residents contacting me to raise concern over the future of the service.

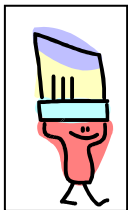
Following a consultation on Mobile Library services earlier this year, I am pleased that the County Council plans to keep the service in Winster. The only downside is that the proposals show that the van will only visit Winster every 4 weeks instead of every fortnight and will make just 1 stop in Winster, instead of 2. Whatever your view, you are invited to have your say by taking part in the consultation on the Derbyshire County Council website or by requesting a paper copy from me.

On another topic, over the past few weeks I have had many complaints about waste collections taking place in the very early hours of the morning and bringing with it noise from the wagons, moving of bins and shouting by crew members. I have reported this to the Council and I have been assured it will be dealt with.

On Monday 14th July the whole of Winster CE Primary School visited the Jorvik Centre in York. We left school early! It was such fun.

Highlights included travelling through the Viking streets of Jorvik, in a time capsule. We even experienced the smells and sights of a Viking toilet! The life-sized models of Viking people alarmed some of our younger children, there was even an argument between two of the models about whether they should have fish or beef for tea. The realistic models made us feel like we had stepped back in time and were now living in the Viking era.

After this we walked to the 'Dig'. Here we learned about all the different weapons Vikings used. These are some of the facts that we discovered: bearded axes were useful to pull the shield from the enemy's hands; throwing axes, if not used carefully, could end up being used in a deadly game of catch; Vikings would not use their expensive weapons, such as metal swords, in battle, they preferred to use a battle axe; for hunting they used a spear but they never went hunting alone as the wild animals, including wild boar, wolves and bears could be very vicious. We are now all Viking weapons experts.

After an exciting day we all returned to school exhausted!
