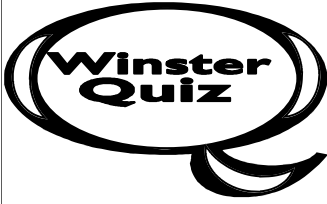

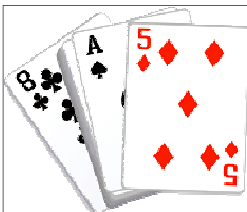

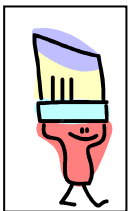

From the Clock Tower

The Winstar church clock was manufactured by W. Potts of Leeds in 1894. The company was a renowned manufacturer of 'public' clocks and were particularly successful in the Victorian period when most public buildings and prominent houses were fitted with a 'turret' clock.

William Potts began making clocks in Pudsey in 1833 before moving to central Leeds in 1862. With a growing fame for the quality and reliability of their clocks the company received a Royal Warrant from Queen Victoria in 1897. Over five generations the Potts family produced some 1,600 public clocks for towns all over Britain and across the world. As demand for their products waned after the Great War the company was absorbed into Smiths of Derby in 1934.

To celebrate the work of this great Leeds company Armley Mills is exhibiting the Potts family's private collection of clocks for the public for the very first time. The Potts of Leeds - Clocks of Character exhibition runs until Sunday 28th September 2014. This exhibition brings together examples spanning the history of the company and features a varied collection of turret clocks, wall clocks, drum clocks and unusual clock-based items.

There are prominent royal clocks and an example of the company's famous railway clock from Argentina. There will also be never-before-seen archive documents from the earliest days of the Potts company.

Essential Gas Engineering Works in Winstar

For those who read the magazine on line and maybe have not seen the letters delivered to houses affected by these works please contact National Grid on 0800 0965678. This is mainly East Bank, and Woodhouse Lane. Properties will be disconnected for a maximum of 24 hours. On re-connection the property will need to be visited to reconnect the gas supply and more importantly test gas appliances. The new gas service is likely to be installed through the existing metal service.

For those who are worried about when the road will be closed and how they can access their house please also ring that number. I understand they will start at the bottom of East Bank from 15 September and when they reach the fork, a decision will be made as to whether to go up to the Flat or take the left fork.

Amazon delivery problems

Amazon have set up their own delivery service, and it now appears to be their normal way of delivering to Winster. But performance - so far - has been terrible.

A combination of unrealistic targets on their drivers and a moronic computer system seem to be responsible for their repeated delivery failures. The experience for the customer is very frustrating: an email to say they are delivering an item that day, then a further email later in the day saying that they had tried to deliver but found you to be out (even if you were in). The telling thing is that they don't leave a "we tried to deliver" card (which they should) - it seems that drivers are just marking the delivery as "attempted" without coming anywhere near you: this has happened to us (six times so far) and, I know, to others in the village. It is worth complaining to Amazon Customer Services each time it happens: complain hard enough and they may give you some compensation (£5 seems to be the limit that front-line staff can offer), and if they have to pay out enough compensation they may start to think of doing something to fix things.

For now, it's best not to count on Amazon to deliver if it really matters to get an item on time.

My Father in law really dislikes the word 'Autumnal', I'm not sure why? Personally I love the word and the season. Autumn is that amazing month of change when nature reminds us gently who the boss is. The leaves change and fall; the days darken and the chill comes in the air.
