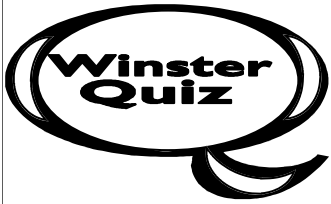

**Walking through Derbyshire History and beyond, by Rev. John Merrill**

John, a former resident of Winster, is well known as 'The Marathon Walker' and author of numerous books about walking. He has also written books on Derbyshire history and historical personalities, some of them based on exploration on foot. Many of you will also know his guides to the history of Winster. John, now an interfaith minister, is an interesting man, who describes himself as 'a free spirit' but not a 'loner'. He says 'I consider myself a Universal Monk exploring and learning about life and the world on foot'. He does no historical research in advance of his walks, preferring to come around a corner to a church, historic house, or sacred site and discover their secrets himself. 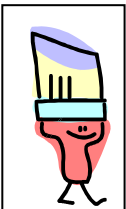

### **Parking at Junctions**

The Council recently received a complaint regarding the parking of vehicles at junctions. Although the complaint was specific to the Leacroft Road junction with Main Street the following reminder applies to all junctions across the village. 243 of the Highway Code states that you should not park opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction. The Police may issue Fixed Penalty Notices for this type of offence.
