

Review for MUSIC FOR A SUMMER EVENING by David Frederickson.

Wyn's Tor Singers - Musical Director: Carol Taylor, Piano: Nigel Taylor, Harpist: Elfair Grug Dyer

The audience at St John's Church Winster enjoyed this concert on Saturday, 13th May by the village's own chamber choir, Wyn's Tor Singers, so much that I heard someone quietly singing along at one point. They began with two sublime sacred motets: Bruckner's 'Locus Iste' and Stanford's 'Beati Quorum Via', both beautifully sung. Equally entrancing were the choir's performance of Gjeilo's 'Northern Lights' and 'Jubilate Deo', by Flemish composer Orlande di Lassus, an exuberant setting of the first few verses of Psalm 100.

We were then treated to some sparkling musicianship by Elfair Grug Dyer a young Welsh harpist, not long graduated from RNCM in Manchester. She played with a beautiful clarity and precision and is clearly going places as a professional musician. My personal highlight was her performance of 'Dafydd Y Garreg Wen', a haunting traditional Welsh air from near to her home in Caernarfonshire. Wyn's Tor then changed the mood with some lively Gospel music - 'Feel The Spirit', arranged by Ken Burton of the London Adventist Choir. After the interval they gave us a varied second half that included the achingly beautiful motet 'Abendlied' by Josef Rheinberger, which he apparently wrote at the age of 15. This was followed by four pieces based on poems: Eric Whitacre's hauntingly lovely 'Seal Lullaby', which is Kipling, 'My Love Dwelt in a Northern Land' by Edward Elgar, a setting of a very old Scottish poem and 'The Bluebird' by Charles Stanford, which transformed Mary Coleridge's short poem into a thing of beauty to which Wyn's Tor did full justice. Finally, their beautiful rendering of Morten Lauridsen's 'Sure on This Shining Night' (a setting of a haunting poem by James Agee) is the third piece by him I think I have heard them sing - Wyn's Tor is becoming something of an interpreter of this modern American composer.

The choir's tenth anniversary concert ended with a triumphant choral medley from West Side Story. Wyn's Tor have come a long way in that time.

Vicar's Letter

Can you believe we're in June already? Where has the year gone? There's been so many 'big' events in the church, local, and international, and there's been lots of events in politics and foreign affairs. On the 4th May 2017 we had our local elections and there were some changes and some continuity of people. Democracy is wonderful, we get chance to choose our councillors and MPs. Many countries do not have the luxury of democracy, My grandad, who fought in the 8th Army all over the place in WWII, always said to us as youngsters 'you must always vote, my friends spilt their blood for that freedom'. At the time I found this a bit dramatic and OTT, but as I've grown up I feel that there was truth in his words. When we vote we are called to be mindful of the needs of all people; needs of people at home and abroad; the needs of our children and grandchildren etc. Its not the priest's job to tell people how to vote. So often in the past priests have been too far removed from political life though. Jesus was a political figure; a radical figure - He wanted all people to live their lives to the fullest. He wanted people to balance that with the virtues of service and love and bridge building. I would say these are the values we should hold and if you think I'm being political that's fine. I must admit one of the best speeches I heard re this topic was on the 4th May. It went like this: "We gather together, we don't fight, we don't cause trouble, we welcome everyone whatever their sex, sexuality, religion, creed and culture or if people have disabilities or not." This wasn't said by the PM or our local MPs or even our bishop. It was the final statement of Bruce Dickinson (frontman of Iron Maiden) at his concert in Nottingham Arena. It was a great concert and his words stuck with me. To live in a civilised society we must be inclusive of each other - not afraid of each other. As Christians we must banish hatred and prejudice and preach and live love, peace and hope. I finish with more words from Bruce Dickinson: "I don't have interns. I don't have a manager. I don't have assistants. I don't have a secretary. I can't figure out Outlook Express. I'm the worst person in the world answering e-mails, and my phone is probably the oldest, most battered phone you can find. So I just talk to people." I think Jesus and Bruce would get on well. Guide to the new 30 Hours Free Childcare and Tax Free Childcare

The 30 hours free childcare and the tax free childcare are 2 new but different government schemes and maybe of interest to anyone with children aged under 12.

30 Hours Free Childcare

The government's new promise of 30 hours free childcare for working parents is far from straight-forward, but we have tried here to make it as simple and clear as possible.

Currently, all 3 and 4 year olds qualify for 15 hours a week free childcare (during term-time) from the term after their 3rd birthday (born 1st Januray-31 March will be free from 1st April, born 1st April-31st August will be free from 1st September, born 1st September -31st December will be free from 1st January).

From September this provision is doubled to 30 hours of free childcare for some families, depending on income levels. Unlike the free provision for 2 year olds (see www.childcarechoices.gov.uk for more info), this is not aimed at those in the lowest income bracket. Instead it is aimed at families who the government deem as requiring it based on their working patterns. However, instead of making it simply available to families where both parents (or the sole parent in a single parent family) work 16 hours it is complicated by the government instead linking income with hours. Thus, parents will need to "earn or expect to earn the equivalent to 16 hours at National Minimum or Living Wage over the coming three months". Put a little more simply, each parent over 25 years old must earn £120 a week (£6k a year), or under 25 £112.80 a week (5.8k a year). This is available for the self-employed, employed and those on zero hours contracts though neither parent can earn more than £100k a year.

The 30 hours free childcare can be split amongst as many as 3 different providers. So your child could attend more than one nursery, or you could use a combination of nurseries and child-minders. There is no requirement to take the full 30 hours; you can take as many as you like up to the 30 hour maximum. It is open for applications now for those who qualify in September (see link below).

Tax Free Childcare

Unlike the 30hours provision, tax free childcare is aimed at those with older children as well as pre-school ones. Your child needs to be under 12 and again both parents (or the sole parent in a one parent family) must work and earn £120 a week (£6k a year), or under 25 £112.80 a week (5.8k a year) and less than £100,000 each. If you qualify then the support is given in the form of a government top-up that can be worth up to £2000 a year per child. You have to open a new childcare account and for every £8 you pay in, the government will add £2. As long as the provider is registered and regulated then this can pay for after school and summer clubs, child minders, nannies and of course nurseries and pre-schools. Winster school is in the process of registering for this government scheme in time for their After School Care starting in September.

Unlike with the 30 hours provision, you cannot claim tax free childcare if you claim childcare vouchers, universal or tax credits.
