akes Week is here and what a packed carnival programme again it is this f V year. You can also follow updates on facebook, search for Winster Wakes Sunday begins with the Crowning of the Carnival Queen, the Children's Art Competition and the Car Treasure Hunt. Monday has the Dog walking, Family Pet Show, Whist Drive and the East Beast Cycle Hill Climb. Tuesday is similarly packed with Cream Teas and entertainment provided by the school children (this is open to the whole village so please come along and support the school). Sport is then the order of the day as Children's sports and the Jonathan Harper Memorial Football Match take place. There is also a chance to view the Art Exhibition and then it's Carnival Quiz time at the Bowling Green. The street will be packed with events, from Punch and Judy, Dangerous Derek the Juggler, Music and the traditional Morris Dancing. Beer and Pimms will be flowing and there will be plenty of food from the barbeque and cakes at the Carnival Café. #### **Winster Monterubbiano Twinning Visit**

On Tuesday 30 May a group of 22 adults and 19 young people set off from Winster to Liverpool Airport on a twinning visit to Monterubbiano. For this visit the focus was on the children, as it had been when the Italians came here for Wakes 2015.

A flight to Rome and a four-hour coach journey brought us in the early hours of Wednesday to the homes, flats and houses provided by our generous hosts. There was to be no concession for tiredness. At 10 am the Mayor was waiting to welcome us in the town hall, followed by the usual exchange of gifts - on our side presented, with a confident speech, by Jadzia Ashin, our Carnival Queen. A guided tour and a museum visit were rounded off with a meal in the park and a chance to meet old friends.

On Thursday the adults went to Fermo, the provincial capital, while the children went to school. Because of earthquake precautions, the primary school had been closed and all ages were housed in the more modern secondary school, where the Winster kids got a taste of the Italian education system. Built-in relaxing time saw many of us meeting up in the café in the main square, followed by another *al fresco* meal and (for those that wanted it) a spot of karaoke.

Much of Friday was spent at the beach (15 miles away), including a meal for 80 visitors and hosts, and afterwards plenty of socialising back in Monterubbiano.

On Saturday and Sunday we were into the feast of Pentecost, Monterubbiano's main festival. There were more communal meals as well as performances by the flag-wavers and drummers, and processions featuring townspeople in elaborate medieval costumes. Several Winster people took up the invitation to dress up and take part. Perhaps the most unusual event for the English was the 'running at the ring', a time-trial in which four professional horsemen gallop a circuit and gather suspended rings on their lances.

Finally, early on Monday, everyone went by coach to Rome, where some visited the Coliseum and others did a walking trip of the main monuments and buildings. We arrived in Winster about 3am on Tuesday and tried to creep back home without waking our neighbours.

We all agreed that this was a marvellous visit - a great learning experience as well as a chance to relax. Despite the hardships in present-day Italy, our hosts could not have been more generous. Already the children are messaging and emailing each other.





#### Winster Village Shop — Loan Note Programme – Update (June 2017)

I am delighted to advise that sufficient loans have been received to allow Winster Village Shop Association (WVSA) to meet the revised payment offer from the venture capital organization (SIB). This means that the business will save over £13,000 in capital repayments and interest over the original period of the loan. Approximately 30 new loan notes have been issued. The WVSA Board of Directors would very much like to thank those who have provided these new funds. Loan note certificates have been issued to all the lenders.

Our secondary objective from this programme was to raise £10,000 for the internal refurbishment of the business. A positive start has been achieved, and approximately 40% of the target has been achieved. We still require a further £6000.00. The Board remains hopeful that additional loans will still be provided.

A total of 500 loan note letters were delivered to every household in Winster, Elton and Birchover, and by email to a number of owners of holiday home properties. Thank you to Carolyn Wilson, and to Andrew and Sharon Talbot for delivering these letters. The Board would also like to thank and recognise the input and organisation from Helen Witty for printing all the letters in the first place and then putting them in envelopes.

# Michael Greatorex installed as Chairman of Staffordshire County Council

n Sunday June 11th 2017, Staffordshire County Council Chairman's Civic Sunday was celebrated in Stafford with a service in The Collegiate Church of Saint Mary followed by a reception in the County Council Chambers. The hosts for these celebrations were the newly elected Chairman, Michael Greatorex, and his Lady Consort, Moira. All local dignitaries were present including the Mayor and party, Deputy Lord Lieutenant, and mayors and chairpersons

of the Staffordshire boroughs. Some family members and friends were also present at this grand occasion.

Michael was born on The Flat, Winster, the youngest child of 5 children. The family then lived on Leacroft from 1949-1965. The Greatorex family lived in Winster since mid.19th century and Joan Barnsley, the eldest of the children, is the sole remaining Winster resident. Michael was educated at Winster CofE School, then Darley Dale Secondary Modern and Warwick University. He worked in local government as administrator/lawyer for many years around the country followed by appointments with legal companies specialising in personal injury factory claims, landlord and tenant and civil litigation. He has lived in Staffordshire for 32 years and entered local politics in 2010 when elected to Tamworth, Staffs, Borough Council, and was subsequently elected to Staffordshire County Council in 2013.



#### **APCM April 2017 - Treasurers Report**

2016 was another year when we failed to have sufficient income to meet our expenditure needs without breaking into out capital funds. As can be seen from the figures we did not receive sufficient income to meet the Common fund requirement of £6136. We are a wealthy Church but our revenue income is small. The majority of our capital is tied to the fabric of the building and is therefore not accessible for day to day expenditure. As time goes on we will increasingly be dependent on the limited capital that we can access, which will not last forever and at the present stands at just over £6000. At the current rate of income and the use of capital funds the church will not be able to meet its Common Fund (Parish Share) payments in the year 2020. What will then become of St. John the Baptist Church in Winster? Ian Sutton. Hon Treasurer.
