
Welcome to the August Edition of the Winster Village Magazine

The East Beast - 2017 - (photos on back page)

A new record time of 49.6 seconds was set by Mike Morris from the West Midlands for the second running of the 'East Beast' cycle hill trial on the Monday evening of Winster Wakes Week. This beat the 2016 fastest time of 55.2 seconds.

The 'East Beast' is organised in partnership with Matlock Cycling Club and this year was run as an Open Event. This meant that the Hill Trial was advertised through the British Cycling Association so that riders from wider afield could be attracted to the challenge. This resulted in Winster being well and truly on the national scene. Whilst most cyclists came from Derbyshire, riders came from as far away as Cornwall, Birmingham, Huddersfield, Leicestershire and Sheffield. In some cases riders took advantage of entering this event whilst having a cycling holiday in The Peak District. The fastest cyclist came from the NFTO Race Club based in Herefordshire. Full results have been placed on the Winster notice board.

Fastest male - Mike Morris 49.6 seconds. (New record)

Fastest female - Sarah Briggs (Matlock Cycling Club - Junior) 80.9 seconds.

Fastest junior - Alex Reynard (Matlock Cycling Club) - 57.6 seconds.

Fastest Elton adult - Andy Brown - 76.7 seconds.

Fastest Winster adult- lain Simpson - 80.8 seconds.

Fastest Winster junior- Alfie Clarke - 91.9 seconds.

Fastest Winster under 10 - Ben Robinson - 140.2 seconds.

Fastest Winster female - Alison Gray - 233.4 seconds.

It was pleasing that the event was so well supported by Winster residents and riders commented that they appreciated the encouragement and applause given to their efforts. Many thanks to the marshals who ensured the safety of riders and spectators. 



Pre-School End of Year Report

South Darley and Winster Pre-school has now completed its first year in the Burton Institute. After a challenging start to the year, numbers have grown steadily and we feel very much part of the Winster community. It was always going to be difficult for us,



moving from South Darley and further away from the population centres of Darley Dale and Matlock and our numbers dropped as a result. These have improved over the year to a healthy total of 19 and we will have at least 12 (after some have left for school) in September, a big improvement on the 6 we started with a year earlier.

We would especially like to thank the Burton Institute committee for their support during the first year and for making the transition so smooth. They have been supportive of everything we have requested and the Institute makes a lovely venue for the children. The main hall offers a wonderful large and open space and the outside is secure and now equipped with a slide and a new mud kitchen. We are also grateful to Alan and Tracey Brown for the generous use of their field for forest school sessions. We have also been made to feel warmly welcomed by the local community; it is lovely to have locals chatting to us over the gate as the children play. A big thank you to Marg and Geoff Lester who entertained us all with a puppet and magic show at our Teddy Bears picnic during Wakes Week. Our thanks also to Francis and Pamela Woodruff for the use of their field for our Easter Duck Hunt.

The parents of local children have also been supportive, encouraging more children to join us and getting involved with the running of the pre-school: with two Winster parents joining our committee as trustees. The school has also offered us support and we hope to grow the partnership for the benefit of both, with plans for joint fundraising activities. Hopefully the presence of the pre-school in the village will also encourage parents of children from further afield to send their children to Winster school. Local children will hopefully benefit by getting to know future classmates; indeed we believe we have all the children who will start at Winster school together in September 2018 attending pre-school together.

Although it remains financially challenging for a charity to run a pre-school in a rural setting, we will begin September 2017 with renewed optimism, buoyed by the support of the people of Winster.

St. John The Baptist Church Winster

In June we celebrated our annual Wakes service. This included song, readings, prayers and gathering together as a community, it was all very nice and there was a full church. I'd like to share a few facts from our united benefice; first the numbers at St. Helen's have doubled in the last 5 years. Sunday service is normally between 60 - 80ish. There is a large number of Baptisms, weddings and funerals. St. Mary's, numbers have grown and if we included the monthly Tuesday worship with school, then the picture is very healthy. Both these parishes struggle, but they pay all their bills and parish share (an amount which goes to the Diocese of Derby). Equally both these parishes take charitable giving seriously. It needs to improve, but there is a sense that giving to others both at home and abroad is very important. I tell you this to give you a context to my next point. Now we come to us at St John's, numbers are approximately the same as 5 years ago, we have very few weddings (even though its a beautiful church) and only a few Baptisms. We have consistently more money going out than is coming in, and although we have invited people of the village to use the church for other events, this has fallen on deaf ears. If things do not change in the near future, the church will not be sustainable. We will be publishing a more detailed leaflet showing information about the church - the mission, the financial situation, the reason it's here and once more an invitation to use the building in new and imaginative ways - for example I am very happy for us to use them for everything from theatre groups to heavy metal bands to jazz to poetry recitals. The leaflet will be out within the next few months and will be available to everyone in Winster. I begin the process of disseminating information in this letter so that the usual occurrence doesn't happen; that age old chorus of "Well no one told me the....." I am telling you, we have a beautiful gem in our church. The mission of the church is to proclaim God's love and mercy. Equally we don't always get it right and for that I apologise. But It belongs to everyone in Winster, it is ours to help flourish or die. What do you want to happen?
