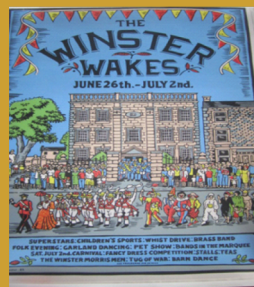

Parish and Local Transport Notices

There are two separate closures coming up between the A6 and the top of Sydnoppe Hill:

Mon 1 Dec 0930-1500

Tue 2 Dec at 0800 to Fri 5 Dec at 1800

Further ahead, the Via Gellia (A5012) has a two-month closure notice (5 Jan to 28 Feb) between Grangemill and Cromford.

The URL link above is to the mapping site Causeway OneNetwork which shows planned works for a long way ahead, but it only shows as much detail as DCC chooses to list. There is no detail of which section of Via Gellia will close when. And there is a warning of disruption in Bonsall over the next "two years" for filming of "Grand Designs" - information which, in the absence of specific dates, appears to be completely useless.

The Parish Council is pressing DCC to be more helpful in giving specific information on exactly which stretches of road will be closed (or face major disruption) when.

East and West Bank, in particular, needs Snow Wardens

Derbyshire CC takes responsibility for gritting Main Street, but not other side roads or paths in the village. For these, it is up to Parish Council to find volunteers who are willing to turn out and help make paths (and/or roadways) passable in ice and snow.

Many parts of the village have their own Snow Wardens, who do a fantastic job of clearing routes. But we don't have anyone to cover East and West Bank.

Train timetables change on Sunday 14th December - with big changes for the Matlock branch.

The new timetable sees Matlock trains run alternately to/from Lincoln and Cleethorpes.

That may be bad news as the extended route involves a very congested crossing with the East Coast Main Line near Newark: a small delay at the far end could see longer delays or even truncations at the Matlock end. It is always a good idea to use the Realtime Trains website to check that your train is running as expected. (If you are starting at Matlock, check that the inbound train is roughly on time, too).

The other bad news is that on Mondays-Saturdays there is now a long gap between first (06:18) and second (07:41) trains from Matlock, although there is an extra train slotted in starting from Ambergate at 06:57.

The sort-of-good news is that timings from London to Matlock will now have a longer connection at Derby - so a slower journey but a much lower chance of missing the connection.

The definitely good news is that the evening timetable has been tidied up and there is now a Matlock connection from the 19:02 from St Pancras. That is particularly useful for those buying flexible tickets like Offpeak and SuperOffpeak returns as this saves an hour of hanging around in London before being able to use their tickets.

Training and (basic) equipment are provided - all we need are the volunteers! The Peak District National Park Authority (the local planning authority 'LPA') is reviewing its Local Plan. The LPA considers that a new Local Plan is necessary to ensure it is up to date and in compliance with the National Planning Policy Framework ('NPPF').

Pursuant to Regulation 18 of the Town and Country Planning Act (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, the LPA is required to notify the following bodies and/or individuals as listed below about the subject of a Local Plan and invite them to make representations to the LPA about what a Local Plan with that subject ought to contain.

- A. Such of the specific consultations bodies as the LPA consider may have an interest in the subject of the proposed updated Local Plan.
- B. Such of the general consultation bodies as the LPA consider appropriate.
- C. Such residents or other persons carrying on business in the LPA's area from which the LPA consider it appropriate to invite representations.

The subject of the new Local Plan is set out in the Local Plan Preferred Approach Consultation Report.

The consultation will run from 9.00 am on 3rd November 2025 to 5.00pm on 21st December 2025 ('Consultation Period') and the LPA invites and encourages all consultees to make representations at the earliest opportunity and in any event no later than by the end of the Consultation Period.
